

Recent and Upcoming Election News

The November General election was held on November 8 with a voter turnout of 78% for the City. Of that, 49% or 7385 votes were cast by an absentee ballot. Looking ahead, those residing in District 8, which is the southeastern section of Mequon, will have a special election on January 10, 2023 to elect a new alderman. A map of the district can be found **here**. Two residents have come forward to run in the election, William Gebhardt and Nancy Urbani. Those in District 8 that would like to vote on election day should go to their normal polling site at Range Line Community Center, 11040 N. Range Line Road from 7:00 A.M. – 8:00 P.M. Council Approves Change to Survey Requirement



The majority of the City's building permits require the submittal of a plat of survey. Previously, the Mequon City Code required the plat of survey to be no more than one year old. On November 9, the Common Council unanimously approved a change in the requirement for surveys, in an effort to reduce unnecessary project costs and delays for property owners. The amendment will provide Community Development staff the flexibility to accept accurate surveys that are older than one year on a case-by-case basis for properties eligible as prescribed by the Code. Flock Camera System Expands To Concordia University

The Flock Camera system installed by the Police Department earlier this year continues to be a big success. This system has led to several stolen vehicles being recovered and several crimes being solved. Now Concordia University has signed on with the Flock System. This will assist the Police Department with coverage on the east side of the newly installed freeway ramps at Highland Road. The Emerald Ash Borer 15 Years Later

The *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* recently published an article on how ash trees infested with emerald ash borer that are still standing are creating a dangerous scenario. In Wisconsin, the emerald ash borer was first found in 2008 near Saukville. The ash are starting to fall over or break in large numbers, becoming increasingly unsafe. For 2022, the City has removed 1,567 ash trees throughout Mequon. The University of Wisconsin estimates there are about 770 million ash trees in Wisconsin. They are causing problems for homeowners, landowners, tree services, and hunters alike. They are also being credited for causing more power outages. Read the full article **here**.
