

Fire & Dispatch Consolidations Take Effect January 1

Beginning on January 1, 2023, the City of Mequon will officially consolidate two of its

public safety functions with other area agencies. One such consolidation, which has been underway since the middle of the year, involves the City of Mequon and the Village of Thiensville combining their respective Fire & Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Departments into the newly formed Southern Ozaukee Fire & EMS Department. Additionally, the Mequon Police Department will cease to operate its combined (police & fire) 9-1-1 emergency dispatch center on January 1. As a result, all emergency calls will thereafter be answered by the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office. The special election to fill the vacant aldermanic seat in District 8 is set to take place on Tuesday, January 10, 2023. Absentee in-person voting at City Hall continues next week January 3 – January 5, 8:00 A.M. – 4:30 P.M and January 6, 8:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M. Voting on January 10 will take place at the Range Line Community Center from 7:00 A.M. – 8:00 P.M.

Also, candidacy paperwork is due in the City Clerk's Office by 5:00 P.M on Tuesday, January 3, 2023, for those seeking ballot access to the aldermanic races on the April ballot. Aldermanic District 2, 3, and 5 terms are expiring in 2023 and will be up for election on April 4, 2023.

12th Edition of Standard Specifications for Land Development

The Public Works Committee approved a new 12th Edition of the City of Mequon Standard Specifications for Land Development (SSLD) at the December meeting. The SSLD is a manual that sets forth the guidelines and requirements for the planning and construction of public and private infrastructure and improvements in the City of Mequon. The past version of the SSLD, the 11th Edition, was issued in June of 2018.

Since then, the Engineering Division has continued to make updates to best practices and the 2022 SSLD has incorporated those practices into the updated manual. The new version will serve as the new requirements for all future projects. The updated SSLD document is available on the City website **here**.
