## Recap of January 10 Common Council Meetings

Preceding the Common Council Meeting on Tuesday, January 10, the Committee of the Whole received a presentation from GovHR regarding an employee classification and compensation study that was performed in 2022 for non-represented positions.

The Mequon Common Council then met at 7:30 P.M. and began with a public hearing to amend a planned unit development (PUD) to allow 10 units for the property located directly west of 11649 N. Port Washington Road. Following the public hearing and approval of the subject PUD amendment, the Common Council acted to:

1. Approve a development agreement for an 11-lot subdivision on the property located at 10766 North Torrey Drive
2. Amend the City Code to establish banquet facilities as a conditional use in the B-2 (Community Commercial) and TC (Town Center) Zoning Districts and conference centers as a conditional use in the B-2 and B4 (Business Park) Mixed-Use Zoning Districts
3. Amend Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code to eliminate the position of emergency dispatcher
4. Authorize a transfer of \$36,661 from the Information Technology (IT) 2022 Budget to the IT Division's Capital Account to complete planned network upgrades in 2023
5. Approve the purchase of two back-up sewer pumps and appurtenances from Wisconsin Pump Works in the amount of \$149,319

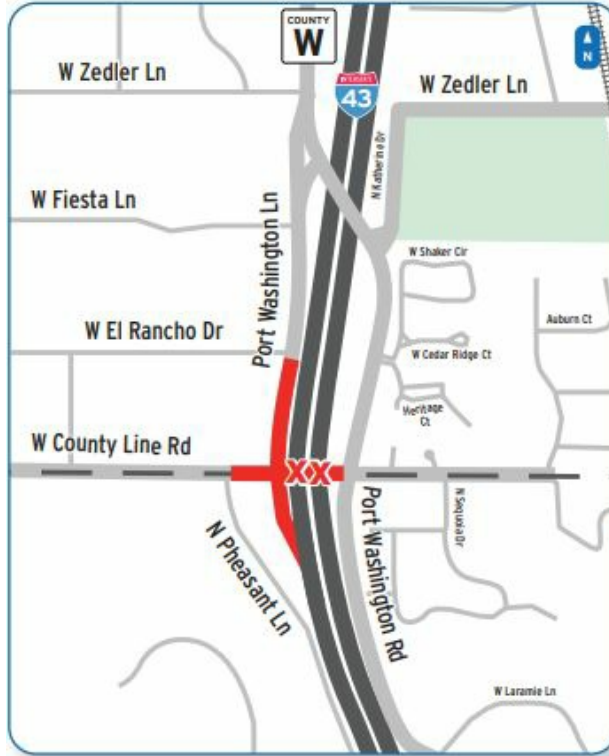

### New District 8 Alderman Elected

A Special Election for the District 8 Aldermanic vacancy was held this past Tuesday, January 10. Bill Gebhardt won the election with 351 total votes, while Nancy Urbani received 287 votes. Alderman Gebhardt will complete the term vacated when Alderman Nerbun was elected Mayor, which runs through April 2024. He will be sworn in at the February 14 Common Council Meeting.

## Demolition of County Line Road Bridge Begins January 16

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is continuing work on the 14-mile, I-43 North-South reconstruction project. Beginning on Monday, January 16, the demolition of the existing County Line Road bridge over I-43 is scheduled to take place for approximately two weeks. I-43 northbound and southbound, is scheduled to be fully closed between Mequon Road and Brown Deer Road during these operations. Weekday operations are scheduled to take place from 10 P.M. - 5 A.M. and weekend operations are scheduled to take place from 10 P.M. - 7 A.M.

Motorists are encouraged to use Brown Deer Road, Wauwatosa Road (WIS 181) and Mequon Road to get around these closures. Businesses and residents should be aware that noise and dust are associated with this overnight work.



## Christmas Tree Pick-up Continues Through January 31

The City is currently collecting Christmas trees through January 31, weather permitting. The Highway Department requests all trees to be placed on the right side of the driveway, facing one's house. In the event of snow while one's Christmas tree is still at the end of the driveway, please remove such as the City will not unbury trees.
