Pioneer Road (County C) to Close Long-Term

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is continuing work on the 14-mile I-43 North-South reconstruction project. Beginning on Monday, March 6, Pioneer Road (County C), between the I-43 northbound ramps and Port Washington Road is scheduled to close to traffic through the fall for bridge reconstruction. In addition, the I-43 southbound ramps at Pioneer Road are scheduled to close to traffic through mid-2023 for reconstruction. Motorists are encouraged to use WIS 60, Port Washington Road (County W), Highland Road, Lake Shore Drive, and Pioneer Road to get around the closure.

Rain and Snow Melt Cause Sewer Overflows

Due to wet weather on Monday morning, February 27, the City experienced sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) at two lift stations north of Mequon Road. Bypass pumping of the sanitary sewer system was required to reduce the risk of basement backups and limit potential private property damage. These are reportable events to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District due to non-compliance with the City's General permit to discharge under the Wisconsin Pollution Discharge Elimination System, WPDES Permit No. WI-0047341-04-0.

Budget Listening Session Taking Place on March 10









Police K-9 Officer Iron Retires
