Preview of March 14 Common Council Meetings

Starting at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, March 14, the Mequon Common Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, will receive an overview of the streetscape design plans for Port Washington Road south of Mequon Road. The Committee will also be given a status update from the Mequon-Thiensville Trails Foundation regarding their proposal to install an off-road bicycle and pedestrian path along Highland Road between Rotary Park and the Ozaukee Interurban Trail.

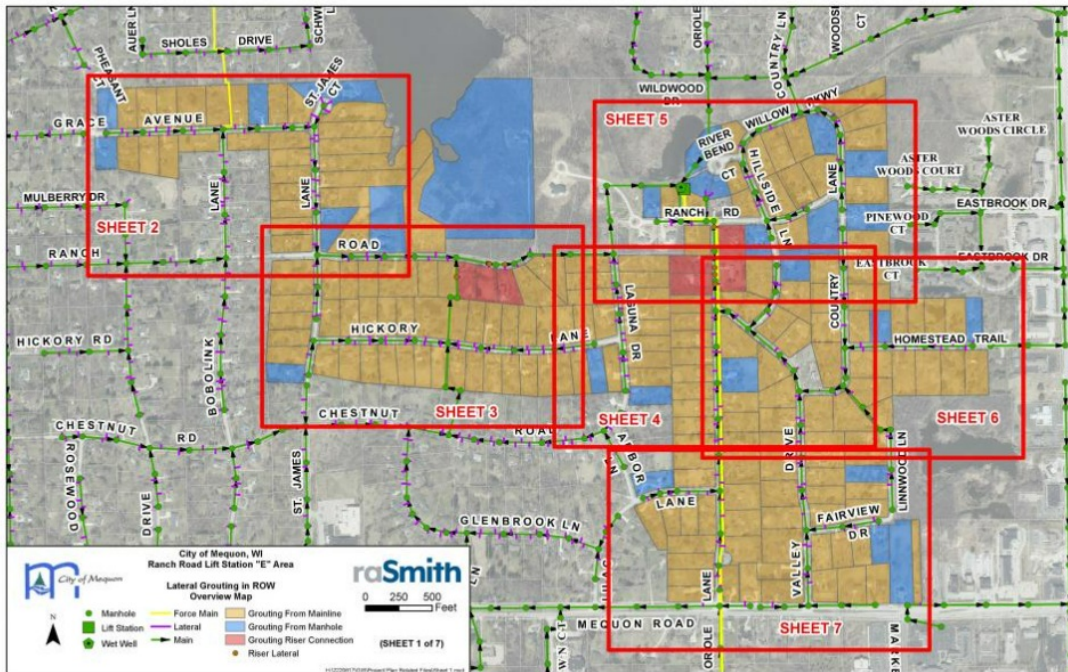
Starting at 7:30 P.M., the Common Council will hold its monthly meeting for March. The Council will consider a number of items, including:

1. An amendment to Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code relating to building and site plan requirements for properties located in the Town Center and Arrival Corridor zoning districts
2. An amendment to Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code relating to allowable turf grass height during the month of May
3. An amendment to Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code regarding setbacks and offsets for properties located within the City's R-2 zoning districts
4. An amendment to Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code relating to administrative code provisions of building permits
5. An amendment to the Planned Unit Development (PUD) for New Castle Place located at 12500-12700 North Port Washington Road to approve a new concept plan and extend the development timeline
6. An amendment to Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code to rezone St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church from R-4 to B-1 (Neighborhood Business District) and IPS (Institutional & Public Service) with a PUD overlay, and amend the City's land use map
7. An amendment to Chapter 58 of the Municipal Code redefining the reimbursement options for sanitary sewer costs
8. An amendment to Chapter 50 of the Municipal Code relating to noise nuisances within the City

The eight proposed ordinance amendments above (except #4) are all on the Council's March 14 agenda for a first reading. It is anticipated that final action on these items will occur at the Common Council's following meeting scheduled for April 11, 2023.

9. Clearing the personal property tax roll of delinquent accounts deemed uncollectible for Tax Year 2021
10. Authorizing a contract with E-Plan Exam for plan review and consultation services with the Community Development Inspections Division
11. Approving State/Municipal Agreement(s) for a State-Let Highway Project with WisDOT for sidewalk installation on Mequon Road west of Wauwatosa Road to Swan Road and/or for sidewalk replacement from Wauwatosa Road east to Buntrock Avenue
12. Approving amendments to the City's 2023 fee schedule for athletic field fees, pool fees, sewer utility user charges, and commercial plan reviews
13. Awarding the 2023 road improvements contract to Payne & Dolan in the amount of \$1,933,000 and authorizing execution of a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Village of Thiensville for reimbursement
14. Awarding the 2023 crack sealing contract to Fahrner Asphalt Sealers in an amount not-to-exceed \$292,000

15. Approving a four-year contract for baseball field management services with SMB Landscape Contractors at an annual estimated cost of \$42,135
16. Approving a contract award to construct a parallel force main for Lift Station "O" to Mid-City Corporation in the amount of \$738,265
17. Awarding a contract to test and seal 218 sanitary sewer laterals in the vicinity of Ranch Road (Lift Station "E") to Visu-Sewer, Inc. in the amount of \$687,632
18. Awarding a design contract for the replacement of Lift Station "E" to Applied Technologies, Inc. in the amount of \$514,205



Public Information Meeting for Building Sewer Lateral Work

The City will be hosting a Public Information Meeting for planned Building Sewer Lateral rehabilitation work on Wednesday, March 15, from 6:00 P.M. – 7:30 P.M. at City Hall. The focus of the meeting is the upcoming contract work in the Ranch Road Lift Station "E" area. Residents in this project area were sent two postcard notices. This meeting will be an informal open house-style meeting that allows attendees to stop in anytime to meet with City staff and project consultants. The sewer lateral work includes rehabilitation of laterals from sewer mains. This work is part of the City's ongoing efforts to maintain a reliable sanitary sewer system and comply with Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District requirements. 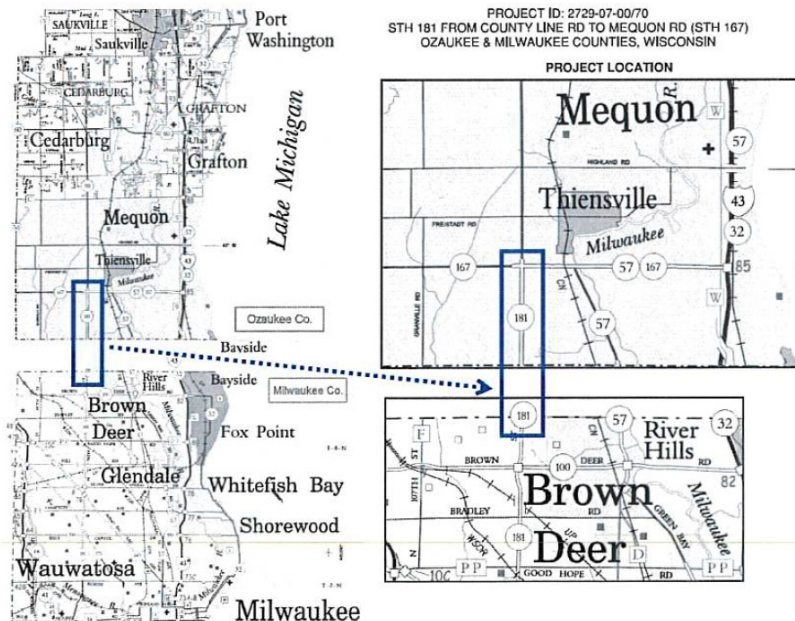


Kohl's Wild Theater at Mequon Nature Preserve on March 11

WisDOT Public Meeting Taking Place on Wednesday, March 29

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) will be hosting a public involvement meeting to present and discuss a proposed 2.2-mile pavement replacement project on WIS 181 (Wauwatosa Road) beginning south of County Line Road and ending at Mequon Road. This project will also include the replacement of existing traffic signals at Donges Bay Road, updates to all curb ramps to meet ADA standards, and a new sidewalk west of WIS 181 from Donges Bay Road to Mequon Road, filling in gaps. Construction is tentatively scheduled for 2026. Those interested in learning more about the project or in providing feedback are invited to attend an open house at Mequon City Hall on Wednesday, March 29, from 6:00 P.M. – 7:30 P.M.
