Council Members Hold Annual Organizational Meeting

The Mequon Common Council held its Annual Organizational Meeting to swear-in newly

elected members, elect a Common Council President and approve various subcommittee and aldermanic assignments for the 2023-2024 legislative year. This year, the meeting was conducted on Tuesday, April 18. In all, one sitting alderman was sworn in following reelection on April 4, Dale Mayr (District 3), and two newly elected alderpersons were sworn in, Kelly Tolocko (District 2) and Gregg Bach (District 5). The Common Council elected Alderman Mayr to serve as Common Council President over the next year, and the following assignments were also approved:

City Staff Working to Address Planned Motorcycle Event July 13-15

This week, City staff became aware of plans for an event called the Farmdale Hog Fest to be held the weekend of July 13 through 15. At this time, the event has not received any approvals from the City that may be necessary for this event. The City has reached out to the promoter of the event to ensure that any activities that may take place on the property are in full compliance with all City and State laws and regulations.

Road Striping Operations to Begin in May



Road striping operations will begin throughout the City in May and continue throughout the summer. Drivers will see a slow-moving caravan of equipment refreshing the lines on Mequon roadways. Mequon Department of Public Works (DPW) urges motorists to use caution when encountering work crews.

Crisp, easy-to-see striping is a significant safety feature on Mequon roadways. The City's DPW work crews use paint embedded with glass beads. The beads reflect headlight beams back in the direction of the motorist to make the stripes more visible, especially at night, on wet roads, or in low light conditions.

Striping crews must travel slowly as they paint roadway markings to ensure a good quality line. The striping train moves between 8 and 12 mph when workers are painting white and yellow lines on the roadways. The trucks have flashing lights and signs that say, "SLOW VEHICLES" and "WET PAINT." While the paint is still wet, there will be traffic cones placed upon the wet lines.
