## **Recap of June 13 Common Council Meetings**

Preceding the Common Council Meeting on Tuesday, June 13, the Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, received a presentation from the Police Chief about adoption of the City of Mequon Municipal Emergency Operations Plan. The Council also received a status update on the implementation of projects identified within the City's 2022-2025 Strategic Plan.

Thereafter, the Mequon Common Council approved a number of ordinances, which included:

1. Amending Chapter 50 of the Municipal Code relating to nuisances within the City,

including noise

- 2. Amending Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code to adjust the travel & training meal allowance to \$60 per day
- 3. Adopting and implementing updates to the City's Municipal Emergency Operations Plan
- Authorizing staff to file the Compliance Maintenance Annual Report (CMAR) for Calendar Year 2022, in accordance with requirements under Wisconsin Administrative Code NR208
- 5. Approving a contract award to complete inspections if 1,011 sanitary sewer manholes to the Sigma Group in the amount of \$48,496
- Approving the award of two contracts for the rehabilitation of 79 sanitary manholes with grout to Great Lakes TV & Seal in the amount of \$70,235 and for the rehabilitation of 37 sanitary manholes with epoxy to Visu-Sewer, Inc. in the amount of \$170,566
- 7. Authorizing a sanitary service deferral agreement for 12204 North Fieldwood Road

#### Captain John Hoell Graduates from FBI National Academy

Chief Patrick Pryor is pleased to announce that Captain John Hoell has graduated as a member of the 286th session of the FBI National Academy. The graduation took place at the National Academy in Quantico, Virginia on June 8. Captain Hoell is the third department member in the last 25 years to complete this prestigious program. Nationally, fewer than one percent of all police officers have the opportunity to attend the program.

Internationally known for its academic excellence, the National Academy offers ten weeks of advanced communication, leadership, and fitness training. Participants must have proven records as professionals within their agencies to attend. The 286th session consisted of two hundred and thirty-eight law enforcement officers from 47 states and the District of



Columbia. The class also included members of law enforcement agencies from 25 countries, five military organizations, and six federal civilian organizations. Chief Pryor stated, "Having another department member graduate from the academy is a result of the department's continuous commitment to the law enforcement profession, and I am very proud the accomplishment Captain Hoell has achieved."

#### Change to Nuisance Ordinance & Construction Noise

At Tuesday's Common Council Meeting, Ordinance 2023-1639 was adopted which amends Chapter 50 of the Municipal Code, affecting construction activities allowable within the City. Construction noises from commercial operations are allowable Monday through Friday from 7:00 A.M. – 9:00 P.M. and from 9:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M. on Saturday, Sunday, and public holidays. Construction noise in regard to homeowner activities is allowed Monday through Friday from 7:00 A.M. – 8:00 P.M. and on Saturday, Sunday, and public holidays between 8:00 A.M. – 8:00 P.M. These times do apply to outdoor power equipment, including lawn mowers, saws, hedge clippers, leaf blowers, snow removal equipment, and the like. However, snow removal equipment may be operated at any time during the pendency of an official snow emergency, and at any time within 24 hours following a snowfall of two inches or greater.
