Recap of July 11 Common Council Meetings

Preceding the Common Council Meeting on Tuesday, July 11, the Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, engaged in a policy discussion about possible industrial land uses in the southwest portion of the City. Following, the Committee received a presentation about the proposed implementation plan for a Classification & Compensation Study that was completed in 2022.

Thereafter, the Common Council met and acted to amend the Mequon Municipal Code related to residential parking requirements for recreational vehicles and other vehicles, such as trailers and boats. 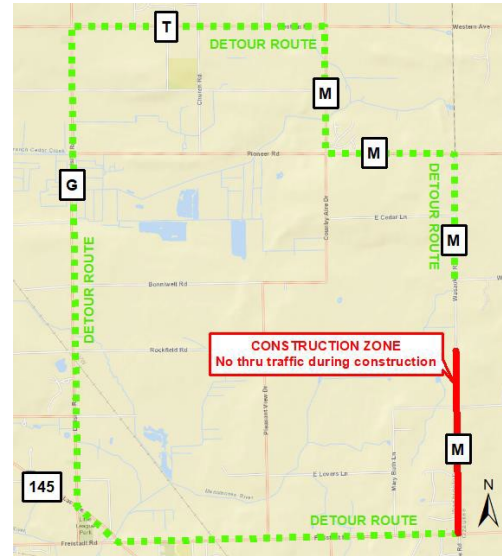


Special Election to Take Place Next Tuesday, July 18

Work to Begin on Wausaukee Road Next Week

Starting on Monday, July 17, reconstruction of Wausaukee Road (County Trunk Highway M) from Freistadt Road to 1.5 miles north into the Village of Germantown and the City of Mequon is scheduled to begin, with a projected ending date in November. The construction project will be closed to through traffic with a detour route using *CTH M*, Freistadt Road, *STH 145*, *CTH G*, and *CTH T* as shown on the map to the right.



Ways to Check Door-to-Door Peddlers' Credentials

The City licenses Door-to-door Peddlers after receiving a favorable background check from the Police Department. Each approved business with their respective salespeople are placed on the City's [website](#), so residents have the ability to verify that the peddler visiting their neighborhood has been vetted by the Police Department. Some requirements for peddlers include carrying the City-issued license with them while selling, wearing a photo ID issued by the company they represent, and refraining from soliciting before 9:00 A.M. and after 7:00 P.M. Lifeguards assume a huge responsibility of keeping swimmers safe. According to International Lifesaving Federation reports, certified lifesavers and lifeguards rescue over 1,000,000 lives each year. The Southern Ozaukee Fire Department recognized Sophia Farias, a lifeguard at North Shore Country Club, with a Merit Award on Monday for her life-saving actions on July 3 in

rescuing a young swimmer.
