Preview of August 8 Common Council Meetings

Starting at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, August 8, the Mequon Common Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, will receive a status update on the implementation of credit card processing. Also, the Council will receive an update on the SOFD & EMS Merger as well as the Southern Ozaukee Fire & EMS Department, which was formally established on January 1.

Starting at 7:30 P.M., the Common Council will hold its monthly meeting. The meeting will begin with a first reading of the following ordinance:

1. Amending the City's Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2023 to adjust budgeted amounts within the Department of Public Works due to unanticipated repairs and material cost increases in a net amount not-to-exceed \$36,576

After the first reading, the Common Council will consider a number of other items, including:

- Granting final plat approval for The Enclave at Mequon Preserve- Phase VI, consisting of 12 single-family lots located at 7901 West Preserve Parkway
- Approving a second amendment to the development agreement between the City and P2 Development for the Town Center Townhomes located at 11110-11112 and 11040 N. Buntrock Avenue, extending the project's completion to October 27, 2023
- Amending Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code incorporating various changes resulting from the first amendment to an Intergovernmental Agreement establishing the Southern Ozaukee Fire & EMS Department
- Amending the City's Financial Policies to include Policy Statement 18: Payment Card Acceptance
- Approving a 20-year limited term conservation easement and intergovernmental cooperation agreement between the City and MMSD and a Memorandum of Understanding between the City and the Mequon Nature Preserve (MNP) in connection with a reforestation and wetland restoration project at MNP
- Ratifying an emergency repair of the City Hall HVAC in the amount of \$16,050 and annualized expenditures in excess of \$25,000 with Dillett Mechanical in Fiscal Year 2023
- Ratifying emergency motor replacement and pump repair at the Community Pool in the amount of \$9,678, a change order in the amount of \$6,436 related to the installation of new lighting in the Library parking lot, and annualized expenditures in excess of \$25,000 with Gillitzer Electric Co. during Fiscal Year 2023
- Authorizing staff to enter into lease agreements with Enterprise Fleet Management for three Chevrolet Equinoxes for an estimated 3-year cost of \$57,388
- Approving the first amendment to an IGA between the City and Village of Thiensville, establishing the Southern Ozaukee Fire & EMS Department
- Approving the purchase of four 2024 Ford Interceptor SUVs from Ewald Automotive Group and the purchase and installation of associated equipment from General Communications in an amount not-to-exceed \$195,876
- Approving receipt of a donation from the M-T Community Foundation in the estimated amount of \$19,000, for the purchase and training of a new Police K9 dog and other associated equipment
- Awarding a contract to rehabilitate seven sewer laterals from external clean-outs in the Riverland Drive Lift Station "H" area to Aqualis in the amount of \$123,027
- Approving a contract award for the completion of MMSD post-sewer lateral rehabilitation reporting requirements in the Riverland Drive "H" and Riverdale Park "F" Lift Station areas to raSmith in an amount not-to-exceed \$39, 062
- Awarding a contract for the inspection of 218 sanitary sewer laterals in the Ranch Road "E" Lift Station Area to raSmith in an amount not-to-exceed \$186,804

2023 Road Program Update



Last week, Department of Public Works crews finished annual drainage work which included culvert replacement and ditching. This week, Payne & Dolan crews started arriving to begin road construction. Crews will be milling and pulverizing roads within the City to prepare for new pavement. It is anticipated that each roadway will take approximately 1 - 2 days for milling or pulverizing to be complete. This work will be followed by compaction and grading prior to the new road surface being laid. Please be cautious and follow crew members' directions when driving through these areas.

Elsewhere in the City, the County Line Road entrance ramp to I-43 southbound and the newly constructed Katherine Drive entrance ramp to I-43 northbound opened Friday, August 4. Also, now open, is County Line Road between Port Washington Road and Pheasant Lane, Pheasant Lane just south of County Line Road, and Port Washington Lane between County Line Road and El Rancho Drive.
