Preview of October 10 Common Council Meetings

Starting at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, October 10, the Mequon Common Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, will review and discuss the Port Washington Road Corridor, including streetscaping, zoning, and incentives. An update on an Operational Analysis of the City's Community Development function that was completed in 2021 will also be provided.

Starting at 7:30 P.M., the Common Council will hold its monthly meeting and will consider a number of items, including:

- Amending Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code to eliminate the bond requirement for certain City Officers, who are now covered by insurance
- Awarding a contract for Fiscal Year 2023 auditing services to Baker Tilly US LLP in the amount of \$32,750
- Awarding a 2024 road improvements design contract for Highland Road and Fiesta Lane to Clark Dietz, Inc. in the amount of \$58,000
- Approving the purchase of four 2024 Dodge Durango Sport Utility vehicles for the Police Department from Ewald Automotive Group and the purchase and installation of associated equipment from General Communications in an amount not-to-exceed \$213,234
- Amending Resolution #4065 to change the model year of an approved police squad car purchase from 2024 to 2025

In order to take proactive measures to improve the performance of the City's sewer collection system, the City shares a sewer televising truck with Brown Deer and Shorewood that rotates locations approximately every three months. Televising is the most effective method to inspect the internal condition of a sewer. The

main purpose of these inspections is to determine the condition of the pipe and if any blockages are present that may require cleaning, replacement, or repair. The inspections also help to detect any cross connections between sewers and help maintain compliance with state and federal regulations. Special waterproof cameras, called crawlers, allow for a visual inspection of underground sewer lines and laterals. The crawler can be placed down a manhole and remotely driven from within the truck down the sewer to the next manhole. Documentation of inspection is critical to a successful operation and maintenance program.
