Recap of November 14 Common Council Meetings

On Tuesday, November 14, the Mequon Common Council held its monthly meeting in the Council Chambers at City Hall. During the Committee of the Whole portion of the meeting, the Council received an update on the Town Center TID #3 Public Improvements Project and reviewed the final version of the TIF #4 and TIF #5 Incentive Policy to spur redevelopment of the Port Washington Road corridor. The Committee also received an update regarding the status of projects within the City's IT Strategic Plan.

Thereafter, the Common Council held its monthly meeting. During the business portion of

the regular Common Council meeting, the Council acted to:

- · Authorize an exception to the levy limit for charges for the Southern Ozaukee Fire & EMS Department for the 2024 Fiscal Year
- · Approve the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating and Capital Budgets for the Southern Ozaukee Fire & EMS Department
- · Adopt the Annual Budget for 2024 and levy for the same
- · Approve a development agreement for the Enclave at Mequon Preserve Phase VII
- · Appropriate the necessary funds from the City's Sewer Utility District for the Year 2024 for Capital Charge Payments to the MMSD and the Utility's Capital Debt Service requirements
- · Approve a certified survey map and accepting the dedication of 1.17 acres of public right-of-way along West Highland Road, abutting the frontage of 12650 N. Wasaukee Road
- · Approve a certified survey map and accepting the dedication of 0.36 acres of public right-of-way along 9832 N. Range Line Road
- · Adopt an incentive policy for Tax Increment Financing Districts #4 and #5
- · Adopt the City's Annual Fee Schedule for Fiscal Year 2024
- · Amend the allocation of \$2,552,000 in proceeds received through the American Rescue Plan
- · Adopt the 2024 Pay Plan for non-represented City employees
- · Authorize a development agreement with DJS Land Management LLC for a TID No. 5 Development Incentive in the estimated amount of \$808,500 for the property located at 10404 N. Port Washington Road
- · Approve an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and the Weyenberg Library, in connection with relocation of the District 3 polling site beginning in 2024
- · Authorize execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City and the Wisconsin Elections Commission, regarding the purchase and use of electronic poll books
- \cdot Authorize execution of an MOU between the City and the Village of Brown Deer, in connection with completing design services for a portion of County Line Road in the amount of \$33,600
- · Approve an agreement for the deployment of eight automated license plate reader cameras with Flock Safety in the amount of \$101,300, for years 2024 2028
- · Amend the City's Financial Policy Statement 3: Reserve Requirements to include the City's Sewer Utility
- · Reassign undesignated cash reserves of \$1,950,000 within the Sewer Utility Fund to one-time capital projects, in accordance with the City's Financial Policy Statement 3: Reserve Requirements
- · Adopt the Fiscal Year 2024 Sanitary Sewer Utility Budget and 2024 Sanitary Sewer User Fee Schedule
- · Ratify an estimated final contract amount of \$55,000 with S.E.H. for inspection services in connection with the Tamerlane Drive Lift Station O Parallel Sanitary Force Main and pump replacement project

Aldermen in Districts 6, 7, and 8 will be up for reelection in 2024. Each Alderman is elected to a three-year term beginning on the third Tuesday in April. To appear on the ballot, candidates must complete candidacy paperwork and obtain 20-40 signatures from residents in their district. Circulation of Nomination Papers begins on December 1, 2023, and all paperwork is due in the City Clerk's Office by no later than 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, January 2, 2024. This past Wednesday, the City joined other communities throughout the nation and celebrated "America Recycles Day." Mayor Nerbun read a proclamation at Tuesday night's Common Council meeting marking the day, and reminding residents and businesses how important it is to become involved in recycling activities and to learn more about the many recycled and recyclable products available to consumers. Notably, the

average American discards 7.5 pounds of garbage every day, which emphasizes the need to continue to focus on initiatives such as waste reduction and composting. Still Time to Register for the Turkey Trot on November 23


