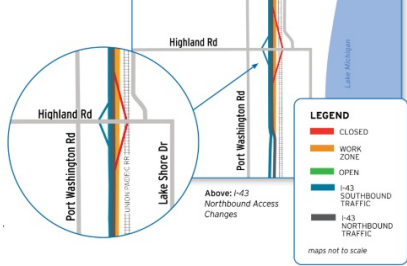
Holiday Lights Kick Off at City Hall and the Gateway



Outdoor Accents was contracted this year to provide the holiday lighting surrounding City Hall. The lights began on Friday, November 24 and will continue through Monday, January 1. The Christmas tree will be arriving early next week and an official tree lighting will take place at Winter Wonderland on Sunday, December 10, by Mayor Nerbun, Super Steel Chairman Paul Luber, and Kohler Credit Union prize winner of the ***Favorite Holiday Memory Contest***. The Menorah, provided by the Peltz Center for Jewish Life, will be lit starting on the first day of Hanukkah which commences on December 7. The Mequon-Thiensville Town Center Gateway was decorated as well for the holidays by Bingle Lighting. Bingle Lighting is also a sponsor of Winter Wonderland and will be providing the light installations in the Library/Pool Parking Lot for the event.

WisDOT Provides Ramp Opening & Closure Update

As of this past Monday, November 27, several opening and closures took place along the I-43 North-South reconstruction project. The I-43 northbound ramps at



Pioneer Road (County C), and Pioneer Road between the I-43 northbound ramps and Lake Shore Drive opened to traffic. The Pioneer Road Park and Ride also reopened. The Pioneer Road Bridge over I-43 is scheduled to remain closed to traffic through mid-December.
