
### Recap of February 13 Common Council Meeting

On Tuesday, February 13, the Mequon Common Council held its monthly meeting in the Council Chambers at City Hall. A representative from the MKE 2024 Host Committee gave a brief presentation about the group's efforts to support the integration of this summer's Republican National Convention with Milwaukee and its surrounding communities. During the business portion of the regular Common Council meeting, the Council acted to:

- Approve a Development & Dedication Agreement with the Mequon-Thiensville Little League for batting cage improvements at Rennicke Field
- Award a design contract for the replacement of various HVAC units and other Council Chambers upgrades at City Hall to Strang in the amount of \$90,000
- Approve the purchase of two Stertil-Koni mobile column lifts from Midwest Equipment Specialists, Inc. in the amount of 30,994
- Authorize supplemental inspection services in excess of \$25,000 during the 2024 construction season with the following engineering firms: Graef, Kapur & Associates, M-Squared North Shore Engineering, ra Smith and Ruekert-Mielke, Inc.
- Approve a Second Amendment to an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and the Village of Thiensville establishing the Southern Ozaukee Fire and EMS Department, in connection with consolidating fire apparatus and equipment

## I-43 Northbound Ramps at Mequon Road to Close Next Week



The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is continuing work on the I-43 North-South reconstruction project, and the Mequon Road Interchange Segment will see some notable changes starting at 5:00 A.M. on Wednesday, February 21. Residents should be aware that traffic on I-43 northbound between just north of Donges Bay Road and Glen Oaks

Lane is scheduled to be shifted west onto the southbound lanes, while crews begin to reconstruct the northbound lanes. Two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained. The I-43 northbound ramps at Mequon Road are scheduled to close to traffic long-term, through late summer. Motorists are encouraged to use the ramps at Port Washington Road and Highland Road to get around these closures. Keep up with the latest construction updates **here**.

#### Regulation Governing Short-Term Rentals in Mequon

Short-term rentals are allowed within the City, subject to certain conditions being met. The short-term rental of dwellings shall only be allowed as an accessory use to the principal residential use of any property. The owner of the dwelling must obtain a short-term rental permit prior to allowing its lease. No permit shall be issued if property taxes are overdue, there are outstanding balances owed to the City, there are uncorrected land use violations, or the property is a nuisance property. In addition, the owner is responsible for the conduct of any guests. Also, a property cannot be used for a short-term rental while it's also being used as a long-term rental. The maximum number of occupants shall not exceed the number allowed per the building code and therefore a floor plan is required to be submitted with the City's permit. A short-term rental period shall be the shorter of the following periods: (1) The period specified in a written or oral agreement, or; (2) the period in which substantially the same people occupy the dwelling without material interruption. Each short-term rental occupancy period shall be for at least two nights.

To apply for a short-term rental permit, residents and/or property owners can contact the Community Development Department at (262) 236-2908. The permit fee is \$60 and is valid in perpetuity or until a violation occurs. Staff will review the permit application and determine if the situation and narrative fits the standards listed above. If so, staff can issue the permit and short-term rental use can begin.

# Candlelight Walk in the Woods - This Saturday at Rotary Park

The 2024 Annual Candlelight Walk-In-The-Woods at Pukaite Woods in Mequon's Rotary Park, 4100 W. Highland Road, is taking place tomorrow, Saturday, February 17, from 5:00 P.M. - 7:30 P.M. The event is a joint effort between the Mequon-Thiensville Sunrise Rotary Club and the City of Mequon and will be the fourth year that it takes place. The event is free and open to the public. The public restrooms will be open, and volunteers from the Rotary Club will be serving hot cocoa with bonfire stations positioned throughout the



park for marshmallow roasting. New this year will be the addition of a Winter Beer Garden hosted by 1840 Brewing. Dogs are welcome but must be leashed. No registration is required.
