Preview of March 12 Common Council Meetings

Starting at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, March 12, the Mequon Common Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, will be provided with an overview of the proposed updates to the floodplain maps for the Milwaukee River Watershed and a Model Ordinance regulating activity within the City's floodplain.

Starting at 7:30 P.M., the Common Council will hold its monthly meeting for March. The meeting will begin with a public hearing, and thereafter, consideration of an ordinance amending Chapters 10 and 58 of the Municipal Code in connection with approvals by the City's Architectural Review Board and adopting updates to the Board's guidelines for residential structures. Following the public hearing, the Common Council will consider a number of other items, including:

- Repealing and recreating Chapter 62 of the Municipal Code relating to the regulation of signs within the City
- Clearing the personal property tax roll of delinquent accounts deemed uncollectible for Tax Roll Year 2022
- Authorizing execution of a Professional Services Agreement for completion of a real estate market analysis of the Port Washington Road corridor between County Line Road and Glen Oaks Lane with Redevelopment Resources in an amount not-toexceed \$69,710
- Amending the City's FY2024 Compensation Plan in connection with establishment of a full-time Management Intern during 2024-2025
- Approving award of the 2024 Road Improvements Contract to Payne & Dolan in the amount of \$1,260,000
- Awarding the 2024 Crack Sealing Contract to Fahrner Asphalt Sealers in an amount not-to-exceed \$252,000

City Seeking Additional Adopt-A-Roadway Program Sponsors

The City of Mequon Adopt-A-Roadway Program is designed to encourage and recognize local groups, (e.g., schools, scout troops, churches, businesses, civic organizations, families, etc.) to "adopt" a two-to-three-mile section of Mequon's local roadway. The program offers groups the opportunity to contribute to the community by picking up roadside litter while generating positive publicity for the group's service activities. Adopt-A-Roadway sponsors take responsibility for their adopted roadway section by picking up litter at least twice a year between April 1 & Nov. 1. The City will erect an Adopt-A-Roadway sponsorship sign with the group's name on it on each end of the adopted roadway segment after the group performs at least two successful clean-ups. 
Daylight Saving Time Begins this Sunday, March 10




Save the Date - National Night Out at Rotary Park on August 6
