## City Hall Upgrades Exterior Lights to LED



Last week, the Department of Public Works Buildings Division upgraded the exterior lighting fixtures at City Hall from high pressure sodium to LED. During the project, wire damage was discovered on seven of the eight external lights of the building and the wiring had to be replaced from the circuit breaker to the light source. Gillitzer Electric provided on-site support by tying in power to the circuit breaker and condensing the loads to only one photocell. This project is one of many LED conversions completed within the last year to help manage costs and electrical usage throughout all City facilities.
