Preview of April 9 Common Council Meetings

Starting at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, April 9, the Mequon Common Council, meeting as the Committee of the Whole, will discuss the implementation of recommendations from a Classification and Compensation Study for non-represented City employees that was completed in early 2023. Also, as a follow-up from last month, an overview will be provided of the proposed updates to the floodplain maps for the Milwaukee River Watershed and a Model Ordinance regulating activity within the City's floodplain.

Starting at 7:30 P.M., the Common Council will hold its monthly meeting and consider:

- Amending Chapter 14 of the Municipal Code in connection with reporting requirements for auctions and secondhand stores
- Dissolving Tax Incremental District No. 2 and authorizing distribution of excess incremental revenue to the affected taxing jurisdictions
- Approving revisions to the Mequon Ward Listing, Ward Map, and polling site designations due to 2024 Senate and Assembly redistricting
- Approving award of the 2024 GSB-88 Bituminous Seal Contract to Fahrner Asphalt Sealers in an amount not-to-exceed \$97,000
- Approving the purchase of a Land Pride AFM4522 Batwing Finish Mower from John P. Lochen Co. in the amount of \$34,900
- Awarding a contract for an update to the City's Comprehensive Park, Recreation, & Open Space Plan to MSA Professional Services, Inc. in an amount not-to-exceed \$50,500
- Approving a pre-development agreement with the Rotary Club of Thiensville-Mequon for development of an all-user inclusive playground at Rotary Park
- Approving the purchase of a 2026 Ford Ambulance from Life Line Emergency Vehicles in the amount of \$365,144

Bypass Pumping of Sanitary Sewer System Initiated

Due to the heavy rainfall recorded earlier this week, the City experienced overflows at multiple lift stations, requiring bypass pumping of the sanitary sewer system. On Tuesday, April 2, Utility staff monitored the flow throughout the day and ultimately bypass pumped at Lift Station H (2932 Riverland Drive) at approximately 2:30 P.M. until 6:30 P.M. and at Lift Station F (12439 North Circle Drive) from approximately 6:30 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. Both lift stations are within the Milwaukee River watershed, in close proximity to the river, therefore the exposure to the public was limited. Bypass pumping at lift stations is a mitigation strategy to reduce or eliminate sewage backups into basements, which appeared to be successful during this event. Sewer Utility staff will file the appropriate compliance documents with the WDNR and continue to implement capital projects to further reduce the risk of sanitary sewer overflows.

Solar Eclipse Viewing Party at Library on April 8

The total solar eclipse will sweep across North America from Mazatlan, Mexico through the United States and eastern Canada.
