

Katherine Kearney Park Tree Removal for Sewer Project

The City of Mequon began a sanitary sewer project and it will include mass tree removal effort at the east entrance to Katherine Kearney Park. This follows the large number of trees that have been adversely affected by Emerald Ash Borer or Dutch Elm disease and have already been removed. In coordination with the City Forestry in an effort to maintain the beauty and safety of this park, we have hired a contractor to remove the trees in portions of the east park area along the walking path (many of which are struggling or already deceased). The east parking lot and the east side of the walking paths will be closed to the public during this sewer construction. The work is scheduled to begin in June 2018 and continue through the summer and fall of 2018. Restoration in planned for spring of 2019. We apologize for any inconvenience, and ask that park patrons please adhere to the signage and request to remain active on the west side of the park. Along with the removals the City will be completing a subsequent restoration later this fall and next spring in the affected areas by replanting trees and expanding prairie areas.
